Bond is Back

This week marked the release of the latest James Bond Movie, 'No Time to Die'. The film premiered earlier this week in 'The Royal Albert Hall,' in London. The London Premiere was attended by British Royalty and Previous Oscar winners. Daniel Craig also attended the red carpet event.



'No Time to Die' is the fifth and final film in which Daniel Craig will play 007. The soundtrack for this movie has been produced by Billie Eilish. As she is only 18 years old, she has become the youngest person to ever write and record the theme song for a Bond movie.

While the Movie was originally due to Premiere in April 2020, it has had to be postponed three times due to Covid 19.

This will be the 25th James Bond movie. The first Bond movie to ever be produced was called Dr. No and it was released in 1962 which was 59 years ago. Bond films seem to be just as popular now as they were then.

Chaos in the Canary Islands

On September 19th 2021, the La Palma Volcano located in The Canary Islands erupted. Lava flowed downwards from the crater and destroyed multiple villages in its path.

Scientists have estimated that the eruption could last up to 84 days. More than 6000 people have had to evacuate their homes.

Fury at Fuel Stations



There have been fuel shortages in the UK since late last week. The current shortages began in London and have since spread all over the UK. The shortages have drawn comparisons to the 'energy crisis' of 1970' but unlike then, the shortage is of drivers and not of fuel.

There are a number of reasons for the driver shortage. After Brexit, many European drivers went back to their home countries or moved elsewhere. While Brexit is a contributing factor to the labour shortage, it is not the only factor. Truck drivers tend to be older and retiring and new drivers are facing delays getting their licences.

In an effort to attract drivers the government has increased working hours and sped up the licencing process. They have also offered 5000 three month working visas to truck drivers from all ethnic groups.

However, petrol running out is not a concern for UK drivers. Oil companies have stressed that there is plenty of fuel.
